FIRST WORLD WAR CENTENARY– SERVICE OF COMMEMORATION AND THANKSGIVING

On 1st July the young people of Crigglestone laid crosses at the cenotaph, Standbridge Lane Cemetery. The service not only remembered the 76 soldiers of the parish who laid down their lives but also gave thanks for those who returned to their families. Year groups from local primary schools laid the crosses and pupils from Kettlethorpe High School took part in the service led by the Rev. Canon Ian Gaskell. Remembrance Sunday 9th Nov. Services will be held at 9:45am Newmillerdam war memorial and also at St James Chapelthorpe at 10:30am.
