ABOUT YOUR PARISH COUNCIL HOW DID WE COME ABOUT?

Parish councils were established in 1894 to take on the duties formerly administered by church wardens and overseers of the poor. They are the lowest tier of government and deal with village community matters.

WHAT DO W€ DO?

Parish councils have a wide range of powers given them through legislation. They have tax-raising powers (known as the 'precept'); they can make byelaws in specific areas; they can provide amenities and facilities such as village halls, parks, playing fields, allotments, bus shelters, parking, litter bins, grit bins, traffic signs, public baths and public clocks! They can make comments on planning applications within the parish. They can deal with Highways, Planning, Cleansing and other District Council Departments on behalf of the local community.

WHAT IS YOUR PRECEPT SPENT ON?

The money is routinely spent on the general upkeep of community buildings such as the Village Hall at Crigglestone, the Community Centre at Hall Green. A substantial sum is spent on the maintenance of parks and open spaces such as Betty Eastwood Park, Willow Garth, Howard Crescent, and Baptist Hill. Other activities include the provision of summertime hanging baskets; Christmas trees and illuminations; supporting crime reduction in collaboration with the Police; provide local organisations with financial support; the council's newsletter; insurance, auditing and employment of a part-time clerk and responsible finance officer.

COMMUNITY HERO

It's that time of the year again to give our community's unsung heroes the recognition they deserve. It could be your neighbour or friend who has done outstanding voluntary work in the Crigglestone Parish. The person does not have to live in the parish as long as they make a difference to our community, and it is in a voluntary unpaid capacity. Candidates for this award need a nominator and supporter **see form overleaf**, but neither of these people have to live in the parish.
