

Priority Patrols:

HGVs on Hollin Lane and Durkar Lane.

Parking issues on Almshouse Lane, the King Fisher and most other roads.

Patrols around Betty Eastwood Park.

Speeding and antisocial use of vehicles.

Patrols around the area regarding TFMV in the early hours.

Crimes:

Hall Green

There were eight reported crimes in Hall Green of which two were classed as serious acquisitive crimes.

The first of these was a burglary residential on Copeworth Drive involving ex-partners. One has turned up and stolen a quad bike from the garden shed. The investigation is still ongoing.

The last was a theft of vehicle on Moorside Crescent where a Vauxhall Zafira was stolen from outside the complainant's home address by unknown means. The investigation is still ongoing at this time.

The other crime consisted of a public order offence and an arson (of a vehicle) on Stoney Lane, a blackmail on Russell Avenue, a damage on Low Moor Crescent and a malicious communication Painthorpe Lane and an assault on Russell Avenue.

Crigglestone

In Crigglestone there were eleven reported crimes of which three were classed as serious acquisitive crimes.

The first was a theft from motor vehicle on Mackie Hill Close where suspect/s have gained entry to a van by unknown means and stolen property. No suspect/s have been identified at this stage.

There was a theft from motor vehicle on Woollen Well Way where the suspect has stolen items from an insecure vehicle. All lines of enquiry have been completed and no suspect/s have been identified at this time.

There was another theft from motor vehicle on Hollin Drive where items have been stolen from an insecure vehicle. Again no suspect/s have been identified at this time.

The other crime consisted of an assault on Hopewell Way, two damages on the industrial estate, an assault on Woodmoor Drive, a damage on Painthorpe Lane, a public order offence on Durkar Rise, a malicious communication on Mackie Road and a public order offence on High Street.

Durkar

There were eight reported crimes in Durkar of which three were classed as serious acquisitive crimes.

The first was an attempted burglary business and community at the Swan and Cygnet on Denby Dale Road where a suspect was seen on CCTV to attempt to gain access to an external freezer. The suspect has not been identified from the footage at this time.

The next was another burglary business and community at Burger King where the suspects have stolen soft drinks and toys from an external container. The investigation is still ongoing.

The last was a burglary residential at an address on Willow Garth where suspect/s have broken into a garage, but not stolen anything from inside. No suspects have been identified and the crime has been filed.

The other crime consisted of an assault at the Euro Garages on Peel Avenue, two offences of fraud (counterfeit bank notes) at KFC and Burger King on Peel Avenue, a theft (other) at Audi and a vehicle interference on Durkar Lane.

Newmillerdam

In Newmillerdam there were three reported crimes of which one was classed as serious acquisitive crime.

This was a burglary residential on School Hill where the suspect/s have stolen keys from inside the house (probably through the letter box) and then stolen a car. No suspects have been identified at this time.

The other crimes consisted of an assault at an address on Barnsley Road and a public order incident at La Fortezza.

Chapelthorpe

In Chapelthorpe there was one reported crime which was classed as serious acquisitive crime.

This was a burglary residential at an address on Wood Lane where the suspect/s have reached through the letter box and removed car keys before stealing the car. The investigation is still ongoing.

Calder Grove

In Calder Grove there were three reported crimes of which one was classed a serious acquisitive crime.

This was a burglary business and community at a shop on Denby Dale Road where the suspects have forced their way in after it had closed and stolen property. Suspects have been identified, but they have not been charged at this stage.

The other crimes consisted of a public order offence at an address on Winden Close and a damage at Rockwood Crescent.

Chapelthorpe

There were three reports of fly tipping on Wood Lane (2 x) and Well Head Mews.

Crigglestone

There were three report of cars racing up Durkar Lane and Hollin Lane (2 x), a suspicious male on Fishponds Drive looking into a property that is currently empty, dog fouling on Haveroid Lane and a report about off-road bikes being ridden across the fields near South View.

Durkar

There were two reports about someone knocking on a door of an address on Howard Crescent, a report about fly tipping on Howard Crescent, and a report about a male in a van who approached a female on Durkar Lane and asked her to get in. Believe the vehicle was a Yorkshire Water van, but no registration was obtained.

Hall Green

There were reports of fly tipping on Hollingthorpe Road and Ashwood Parade.

Newmillerdam

There was a report about a potentially dangerous dog around the park and reports about fly tipping on Barnsley Road and Slack Lane.

Officer Activity:

PC Steel reports:

10/04/2017 between 1200 x 1400

Patrols made of area by Operation Matrix (off-road motorcycle team) as part of SAFE scheme between 12:00 X 14:00 on 10/04/2017. Patrolled Crigglestone High Street and the local woods at the rear of the rugby ground. No issues. I also patrolled surrounding fields with attention paid to Starbucks etc. No problems. Attended at "THE CLOSE" in Cirgglestone and visited a local nominal who was heavily involved in antisocial behaviour regarding nuisance bikes last year. I could see 2 x mopeds in his rear garden but there was no answer to knocking.

I also patrolled the entrance to Newmillerdam near the riding for disabled school due to recent reports of parking problems and stones being removed. It was busy today presumably due to school holidays but no offences committed.

Whilst patrolling general area I came across an RTC (collision). Whilst speaking with driver it became apparent he had been drinking alcohol. He was breathalysed and arrested for OPL (drink driving).

PC Steel reports:

20/04/2017 between 2200 x 0000

Patrols between 22:00hrs and 00:00hrs on 20/04/2017. Patrolled High Street/Painthorpe Lane area as well as surrounding fields. Very few people about. Only activity was report of a suspicious vehicle on Daw Green Avenue at 23:30hrs. An area search was made and the vehicle located. He was in fact a delivery driver looking for an address.

There were no calls for service during my tour.

PCSO Kuritzen reports:

26/04/2017 between 2300 x 0100

Safe scheme carried out between 2300hrs and 0100hrs on 26/04/17. Areas patrolled were Stoney Lane. I checked the stone wall on the bad bend to see if any vehicles were parked near the wall that could be stealing stones but none were sighted. Painthorpe Lane, Daw Green Avenue, Haveroid Lane, Fishponds Lane. I patrolled around the KFC car park for nuisance vehicles but none were present.

PC Steel reports:

30/04/2107 between 1200 x 1400

Patrols of area on 30/04/2017 between 12:00 x 14:00. There has been a big increase in reports of bikes around Painthorpe Lane area. I spent a lot of time in and around that area including the woods and fields which draw the bikers to the area. 1 x off roader sighted which made off and was not located. Following this no more bikes appeared, and no reports for area through rest of shift.

Whilst patrolled High Street in Crigglestone several locals stopped me and stated that the mopeds which caused a big problem last year have been riding around again. As a result I visited the two local nominals who are involved in the scooter activity. Spoke to parents of both males as they themselves weren't in. Both police friendly and stated they will keep an eye out. No sightings through overtime and during rest of shifts. No other issues.
