Priority Patrols:

HGVs on Hollin Lane and Durkar Lane.

Parking issues on Almshouse Lane, the King Fisher and most other roads.

Patrols around Betty Eastwood Park for the rough sleeper.

One Stop (High Street) after 2300 hours.

Speeding locations are Dennington Lane, Painthorpe Lane and Barnsley Road.

Patrols around the area regarding TFMV in the early hours.

Crimes:

Chapelthorpe

In Chapelthorpe there were three reported crimes. Of these two were serious acquisitive crimes.

The first was a theft from motor vehicle on Stoney Lane where a jacket and sunglasses were stolen from a car, but it is unclear as to how entry was gained. All lines of enquiry have been completed and this crime has been filed.

The second was a theft from motor vehicle on Wood Lane where a football shirt, books and other miscellaneous items had been stolen. Some of the property was recovered by police on a nearby footpath. It is believed that the vehicle had been left insecure.

The other crime consisted of a theft of pedal cycle on Stoney Lane.

Newmillerdam

In Newmillerdam there was one reported crime which was a serious acquisitive.

The offence was a theft of motor vehicle (Vauxhall Insignia) from the country park car park. All lines of enquiry have been completed and no suspects have been identified. The vehicle has not be located at this time.

Crigglestone

In Crigglestone there were twenty reported crimes. Of these four were serious acquisitive crimes.

The first was a theft from motor vehicle on New Hall Close where a vehicle has been left insecure and items have been stolen from within. The investigation is still ongoing into this offence.

Then there was a theft of motor vehicle reported on Woodmoor Rise where the suspects have stolen the keys to a Mercedes from inside the victim's other vehicle. The vehicle has not been located at this time.

There was another theft of motor vehicle on High Street where suspects have taken a Suzuki Vitara. The vehicle was found two days later by the owner on Hall Lane (Chapelthorpe) and recovered it. No damage was caused.

The last of these was a theft from motor vehicle on Bull Lane where jewellery and headphones were stolen from an insecure vehicle. All lines of enquiry have been completed and the crime has been filed.

The other crimes consisted of a public order offences on Garden Terrace and Daw Green Avenue, criminal damages on Hollin Lane, Woodmoor Rise and two on Painthorpe Lane, a harassment and vehicle interference on Woodmoor Drive, malicious communication on Garden Terrace and West View, and six

assaults (Hollin Lane, Upper Close Way, Manor Farm Road, Common Way, Painthorpe Terrace and Mackie Hill J & I School).

Hall Green

In Hall Green there were seven reported crimes. Of these three were serious acquisitive crimes.

The first was an aggravated vehicle taking on Hollingthorpe Lane where a BMW has been taken from an address and crashed 100 yards away. The investigation is still ongoing into this offence.

The next was a theft from motor vehicle on Hollingthorpe Lane where power tools have been stolen from a van. The locks were attacked on the van to gain entry. The investigation is still ongoing.

The last of these was a theft from motor vehicle on Hollingthorpe Road were an insecure vehicle has been entered and a bicycle stolen from inside. The investigation is still ongoing.

The other crimes consisted of an assault, criminal damage and a public order offence on Copeworth Drive and a malicious communication on Low Moor Crescent.

Durkar

In Durkar there were eight reported crimes. Of these none were serious acquisitive crimes.

The reported crimes consisted of a criminal damage at an address on Durkar Lane, two make off without payments and a public order offence at the Calder Park Service Station, a criminal damage on Howard Crescent, an assault at KFC (Calder Park), an assault at The New Inn (Denby Dale Road East) and an assault on Denby Dale Road East.

Calder Grove

In Calder Grove there were five reported crimes. Of these one was a serious acquisitive crime.

This was a burglary at the Cedar Court Hotel where suspects have removed a window to a downstairs guest bedroom and stolen property. No suspects have been identified and the crime has been filed.

The other crime consisted of an assault at the British Oak Public House, a theft at Cedar Court Hotel, and two criminal damages on Hollin Lane.

Anti-Social Behaviour:

In Crigglestone there were two calls about youths setting a fire off Daw Lane. There were two calls regarding suspicious males. The first was on Durkar Lane where the male was seen to be looking up driveways. The second was on Woodmoor Drive where two males were seen to be trying car doors.

In Durkar there was a car seen driving erratically on the M1 exiting at Junction 39. There was also a call about a large group of youths on bicycles near to Denby Dale Road. Police had already spoken with this group and moved them on from the Calder Park services. There was also a call regarding a suspicious blue Transit van on Broad Acres.

In Hall Green there was a call regarding a male seen looking into cars on Copeworth Drive.

In Newmillerdam there was a call regarding a grey van whether the driver had beckoned to a fourteen year old girl. She ran off and did not engage. There was also a call from the landlord of the Fox and Hounds regarding a nuisance male. This male turned out to be local and known to have mental health issues.

There were no ASB related calls in Calder Grove or Chapelthorpe.

Officer Activity:

PCSO 438 reports: 04/01/17 between 1400 x 1700

Safe scheme carried out between 1400hrs and 1700hrs on 04/01/17. Areas patrolled were Stoney Lane, Wood Lane, Fishponds Lane, Hollin Lane, the church grounds around St James and the methodist church on Crigglestone High Street. I patrolled the Betty Eastwood Park and spoke with residents in the park. Many commented about the homeless male who had set up a tent in the park a few days earlier. I spoke with Cllr Platten who was in the park doing some litter picking. Cllr Platten commented on the rubbish in the park from the One Stop shop. I informed Cllr Platten that I was working on the safe scheme. There was no ASB or parking obstructions sighted.

PCSO 438 reports: 05/01/17 between 1400 x 1700

Safe scheme carried out between 1400hrs and 1700hrs on 05/01/17. Areas patrolled were Painthorpe Lane, Daw Green Avenue, Haveroid Lane, Hollin Lane, High Street and the Betty Eastwood Park. I had a look around where the unknown male had camped out for drugs paraphernalia at the request of Cllr Platten but none were sighted. There was no parking obstructions or ASB witnessed.

PC 2534 reports: 10/01/2017 between 1130 x1330

Speed Enforcement using Pro Laser conducted.

Not much traffic but those that were observed not many sticking to limit, numerous around 32-34mph and the above.

11/01/2017 between 1200 x 1400

Patrols made of area on 11/01/2017 between12:00 X 14:00. Patrols made on off road motorcycle. Patrolled wooded areas due to high volume of nuisance bikes reported recently. Attention paid to area around Rugby Club off Daw Green/Painthorpe Lane area. There were tracks in the woods clearly form a motorbike but no actual bikes seen. Attention was also paid to known nominals in Crigglestone who are causing a nuisance on their bikes. None of them were home when visited.

No other issues.

PCSO 996 reports:

13/01/2017 between 0000 x 0200

2 hrs safe scheme in Crigglestone. Patrolled Betty Eastwood Park, but there were no signs of the rough sleeper. Curfew check conducted on a prolific offender at 01hrs at their home address.

Checked One Stop shop, skips in order.

PC 1188 reports:

13/01/2017 between 0100 x 0400

Proactive patrols conducted across the Crigglestone Parish area, but no one was sighted.

PCSO 996 reports:

14/01/2017 between 0000 x 0200

2 hours safe scheme from midnight to 02:00hrs.

Patrolled Betty Eastwood Park. No issues. Calder Park clear of boy racers. 00:44hrs curfew check of a prolific offender. One Stop shop skips intact. No issues and no call for service.

PCSO 996 reports:

21/01/2017 between 2300 x 0100

Patrolled Betty Eastwood Park. No issues. Curfew checks done. 14 boy racers made off from an officer in Starbucks car park and headed to McDonald's carpark. One Stop shop check and no issues found.

Proactive patrols conducted. One male stopped and spoken to on Bull Lane, but no further action taken. No other incidents of note to report.

I spent some time in the Daw Green area due to reports of nuisance bikes previously. I stopped male believed responsible before. No issues whatsoever and fully documented.

Spoke to several residents who are neighbours of known bike users. They stated there had been no issues recently.

PCSO 438 reports:

24/01/2017 between 1400 x 1700

Safe scheme carried out on foot patrol between 1400hrs and 1700hrs on 24/01/17. Areas patrolled were Hollin Lane, Copeworth Drive, Painthorpe Lane, Haveroid Lane, Betty Eastwood Park, High Street and the Methodist church grounds. There were no parking obstructions or ASB. In the Betty Eastwood Park a local resident was cleaning up litter that had been left in the park from the One Stop shop. It is believed that the homeless male is still residing in the park and is bringing bags of rubbish from the shop to look for waste food then just dumping the bags.

PCSO 438 reports:

25/01/2017 between 1400 x 1700

Safe scheme carried out between 1400hrs and 1700hrs on 25/01/17 on foot patrol. Areas patrolled were Hollin Lane, Fishponds Lane, Stoney Lane, Wood Lane, Betty Eastwood Park, and the church grounds of St James and the Methodist church on Crigglestone High Street. 5 police warning notices were issued to vehicles parked blocking the pavement on Stoney Lane. I spoke with the workmen who were working on the building site on Stoney Lane near to the Bay Horse pub and warned them about parking causing obstructions by blocking the pavement for pedestrians and wheelchair users.
