# **Priority Patrols:**

The priorities this month were ASB use of vehicles, ASB in Betty Eastwood Park and speeding throughout the parish.

## **Crimes:**

#### **Calder Grove**

There were two reported offences in Calder Grove, neither of which were classed as serious acquisitive crimes. They were a harassment on Hollin Lane and a malicious communication on Sandpiper Road.

## Chapelthorpe

There was one reported offence in Chapelthorpe. This was not classed as a serious acquisitive crime. It was a possession of an offensive weapon at the Bay Horse Pub.

## Crigglestone

In Crigglestone there were thirteen reported offences. Of these five were classed as serious acquisitive crimes.

The first was a burglary residential at Cliff Drive where a summer house was broken into and a TV and PS4 were stolen. Enquiries revealed that two males in tracksuits were seen getting out of a vehicle near the address at the time that appeared suspicious, but there was insufficient information to identify them or the vehicle. All other lines of enquiry have been completed and the crime has been filed.

The second was a burglary residential at an address on Stoney Lane where suspect/s have forced entry to a detached garage and shed, but not stolen any property. The victims believe that they may have disturbed the suspect/s, but did not contact the police at that time. All lines of enquiry have been completed and the crime has been filed.

The third was an attempted burglary residential at an address on Durkar Rise where suspect/s have attacked the lock, but failed to gain entry.

The fourth was a burglary residential on Moor View where suspects have gained entry through rear patio doors, stolen car keys and then the car. The vehicle was recovered after being used in other offences on false plates. The vehicle has been recovered by the police and the crime is still under investigation.

The fifth was a burglary residential on St James Road where the property has been broken into by attacking the euro profile lock and keys to an Audi S3 were stolen. The vehicle was stolen from the drive and used in offences across the country. The vehicle has now been recovered by the police and the investigation is still ongoing.

Working in partnership to reduce crime

The other offences consisted of assaults on Painthorpe Lane, Daw Green Avenue and Haslegrave Park, two theft from shops on High Street, a theft (other) on High Street, a public order crime on High Street, a damage on Painthorpe Lane and the distribution of indecent images on West View.

#### Durkar

There were twelve reported crimes in Durkar. One of these was classed as serious acquisitive crime.

This was the theft of a Honda motorcycle from the garden of a property on The Close. The investigation is currently ongoing and a suspect has been linked.

The offences consisted of an assault, three theft from shops, a drugs possession, a public order crime and a false imprisonment on Denby Dale Road, a make off without payment from Grange Service Station, a theft of pedal cycle on Denby Dale Road East, a public order crime on Willowgarth, and a damage at Premier Inn

#### Hall Green

In Hall Green there were six reported offences. Of these one was classed as a serious acquisitive crime.

This was a burglary residential at an address on Marshall Avenue where suspect/s have forced a rear window, conducted an untidy search and stolen a laptop, games console, audio equipment and Canon camera. Enquiries are still ongoing into this crime.

The other offences consisted of an assault on Grenville Walk, a theft of bricks on Beech View and three damages on Copeworth Drive.

#### Newmillerdam

There were two reported offences in Newmillerdam, neither of which were classed as serious acquisitive crimes. They were an assault and a public order crime at the Hotel St Pierre.

# **Anti-Social Behaviour:**

#### Calder Grove

There were no ASB related calls in Calder Grove.

# Chapelthorpe

There were no ASB related calls in Chapelthorpe.

# Crigglestone

There were ten ASB related calls in Crigglestone. These were one about nuisance youths jumping on a car on Common Way, another about youths throwing things at an address on Common Way, two calls

regarding nuisance youths throwing sand and stones at a house on Manor Farm Court, two calls regarding nuisance youths throwing mud and stones at a house on Painthorpe Lane, fly tipping on Dennington Lane, High Street and Painthorpe Lane (x2).

### Durkar

There was one ASB related call in Durkar. This was about nuisance youths throwing eggs at a house on Badger Close.

### Hall Green

There was one ASB related call in Hall Green. This was a call about nuisance youths throwing eggs at a house on Castle Meadows.

### Newmillerdam

There were three ASB related calls in Newmillerdam. Two were regarding fly tipping on Slack Lane and the other was about youths congregating on the fields off Slack Lane.

## Officer Activity:

PCSO 438 Kuritzin reports:

03/10/2017 and 04/10/2017 between 2300 x 0100

Safe scheme carried out between 2300hrs and 0100hrs on 3rd and 4th October 2017.

Areas patrolled were the KFC / Starbucks car park off Peel Avenue. 2x drivers of vehicles were warned for excessively sounding their horns when stationary.

On both nights the areas of Hall Green, Chaplethorpe and Crigglestone were patrolled main roads and residential streets. There was no ASB or crime encountered.

### PC 6487 Steel reports:

08/10/2017

Patrols made as part of SAFE scheme on Off Road Motorbike on 08/10/2017. There have been minimal reports lately in relation to nuisance bikes. Usual hotspots patrolled but no fresh tracks seen. Only incident of note was following up on complainant from local parish councillors in relation to a nuisance bike in Betty Eastwood Park. Rider was identified and tracked down to an address in Woolley. Male was spoken to and advised regarding potential offences.



## Crigglestone Parish Council &

Working in partnership to reduce crime

### PCSO 438 Kuritzin reports:

13/10/2017 between 2300 x 0100

Safe scheme carried out between 2300hrs and 0100hrs on 13/10/17. Areas patrolled were the KFC/Starbucks car park off Peel Avenue. There was no inappropriate driving witnessed. The villages of Crigglestone, Hall Green and Chapelthorpe were patrolled and attention was paid to Almshouse lane for parking obstructions but none were sighted.

## PC 6254 Varley reports:

17/10/2017 and 18/10/2017 between 1100 x 1400

Attended the Crigglestone and Hall Green areas to conduct static speed checks. Checks conducted on Hollin Lane, Denby Dale Road and Painthorpe Lane.

Number of vehicles stopped and checked. 6 drivers issued with Traffic Offence Reports for exceeding 30mph (between 37 and 42mph). 1 vehicle seized for no insurance and driving otherwise than in accordance with driving licence on Cliff Road. The driver has been reported for summons for the offences.

Number of other drivers advised at speeds between 33 and 36mph.

Unable to conduct many checks on Hollin Lane due to temporary traffic signals forcing traffic to slow/stop.

### PCSO 438 Kuritzin reports:

23/10/2017 and 24/10/2017 between 2300 x 0100

Safe Scheme carried out between 2300hrs and 0100hrs on 23rd and 24th October. Areas patrolled were the KFC/Starbucks car park off Peel Avenue. There was no inappropriate driving sighted. The villages of Crigglestone, Hall Green and Chaplethorpe were patrolled and particular attention was paid to Almshouse Lane, Slack Lane, Stoney Lane, Painthorpe Lane and Haveroid Lane on both nights. On the 24th 4x male youths were stopped and spoken to. On both nights I did not encounter any crime or ASB and all areas were quiet.
